CHECK CONDITIONS BELOW FOR YOUR ENTITLEMENT TO CONCESSION

The following concessions are not applicable to vehicles with an unladen mass or manufacturer's GVM greater than 4500kg.

REGISTRATION

INCAPACITATED PERSONS

EXEMPTION FROM PAYMENT OF STAMP DUTY ON THIRD PARTY INSURANCE AND VALUE

A person who registers a vehicle under the conditions described in Section 38 or 38AB of the Motor Vehicles Act (M.V.A.) is automatically exempted from payment of stamp duty on the value of the vehicle and on the Third Party Insurance. The exemption applies to ONE VEHICLE ONLY registered in the person's name.

INCAPACITATED EX-SERVICE PERSON (T.P.I.)

M.V.A. Section 38B (66.6% rebate)

- (1) If the Registrar is satisfied by such evidence as the Registrar requires that -
 - (a) a motor vehicle is owned by a person who has been a member of a naval, military, or air force of Her Majesty; and
 - (b) the owner, as a result of service in a naval, military, or air force, is total and permanently incapacitated, or is blind, or has lost a leg or foot, or receives under the laws of the Commonwealth relating to repatriation a pension at the rate for total incapacity, or a pension granted by reason of impairment of the power of locomotion at a rate not less than seventy per cent of the rate for total incapacity; and
 - (c) the motor vehicle will during the period for which it is sought to be registered be wholly or mainly used for the transport of the owner, the prescribed registration fee for that motor vehicle must be reduced by the prescribed amount.
- (2) This section does not apply to or in relation to -**
 - (a) more than one motor vehicle owned by the same owner; or
 - (b) any motor vehicle in respect of the registration of which a reduced fee is payable pursuant to any provision of this Act other than this section.
 - (3) If the registered owner of a motor vehicle that has been registered at a reduced fee in accordance with this section dies, or ceases to be the owner of the vehicle, the registration will, subject to this Act, continue in force for a period of one month after death, or the cessation of ownership, and will, unless the balance of the prescribed registration fee is paid, become void upon the expiration of that period.

INCAPACITATED PERSON

M.V.A. Section 38B (50% rebate)

- (1) If the Registrar is satisfied by such evidence as the Registrar requires that the owner of a motor vehicle is -
 - (a) in consequence of the loss of the use of one or both legs, permanently unable to use public transport; and
 - (b) the motor vehicle will during the period for which it is sought to be registered be wholly or mainly used for the transport of the owner;Or is the parent/guardian of a child who is -
 - (a) in consequence of the loss of the use of one or both legs, permanently unable to use public transport; and
 - (b) the motor vehicle will during the period for which it is sought to be registered be wholly or mainly used for the transport of the child, the prescribed registration fee for that motor vehicle must be reduced by the prescribed amount.
- (2) This section does not apply to or in relation to -**
 - (a) more than one motor vehicle owned by the same owner; or
 - (b) any motor vehicle in respect of the registration of which a reduced fee is payable pursuant to any provision of this Act other than this section.
 - (3) If the registered owner of a motor vehicle that has been registered at a reduced fee in accordance with this section dies, or ceases to be the owner of the vehicle, the registration will, subject to this Act, continue in force for a period of one month after death, or the cessation of ownership, and will, unless the balance of the prescribed registration fee is paid, become void upon the expiration of that period.

PENSIONER

EXEMPTION FROM PAYMENT OF STAMP DUTY ON THIRD PARTY INSURANCE

A person who registers a vehicle under the conditions described in Section 38A or 38AB of the Motor Vehicles Act is automatically exempted from payment of stamp duty on the insurance.

PENSIONER CONCESSION – VEHICLE

M.V.A. Section 38A (50% rebate)

- (1) If the Registrar is satisfied by such evidence as the Registrar requires that the owner of a motor vehicle -
 - (a) is entitled, as the holder of -
 - (i) a State concession card of a prescribed class; or
 - (ii) a pensioner entitlement card issued under any Act of Law of the Commonwealth, to travel on public transport in this State at reduced fares;and
 - (b) the motor vehicle will during the period for which it is sought to be registered be wholly or mainly used for the transport of the owner, the prescribed registration fee for that motor vehicle must be reduced by the prescribed amount.
- (2) This section does not apply to or in relation to -**
 - (a) more than one motor vehicle owned by the same owner; or
 - (b) any motor vehicle in respect of the registration of which a reduced fee is payable pursuant to any provision of this Act other than this section.
 - (3) If the registered owner of a motor vehicle that has been registered at a reduced fee in accordance with this section dies, or ceases to be the owner of the vehicle, the registration will, subject to this Act, continue in force for a period of one month after death, or the cessation of ownership, and will, unless the balance of the prescribed registration fee is paid, become void upon the expiration of that period.

PENSIONER CONCESSION – TRAILER

M.V.A. Section 38AB (50% rebate)

- (1) If the Registrar is satisfied by such evidence as the Registrar requires that the owner of a motor vehicle -
 - (a) is entitled, as the holder of -
 - (i) a State concession card of a prescribed class; or
 - (ii) a pensioner entitlement card issued under any Act of Law of the Commonwealth, to travel on public transport in this State at reduced fares;and
 - (b) the trailer will during the period for which it is sought to be registered be wholly or mainly used for the transport of the owner, the prescribed registration fee for the trailer must be reduced by the prescribed amount.
- (2) This section does not authorise the registration at a reduced fee of more than one trailer owned by the same owner.**
- (3) If the registered owner of a trailer that has been registered at a reduced fee in accordance with this section dies, or ceases to be the owner of the trailer, the registration will, subject to this Act, continue in force for a period of one month after the death, or the cessation of ownership, and will unless the balance of the prescribed registration fee is paid, become void upon the expiration of that period.

LICENCE

50% rebate

Where an applicant qualifies under Sections 38 or 38A for reduced registration fees (as indicated above), a reduction is also available for driver's licence fees.

Note: Clause 22 (3) (a) of Schedule 1 in the Motor Vehicles Regulations states: "If a person ceases to be a concession card holder and the person holds a driver's licence that was issued or renewed on payment of a reduced fee, the person must pay an additional fee that is equal to the difference between the fee paid for the issue or renewal of the licence and the fee that would normally have been payable."
