- A disability parking permit may be issued to an organisation that provides services to at least four people with disabilities which include transportation services.
- The people whom the organisation are providing services for must meet the eligibility criteria for a disability parking permit (DPP). **PLEASE REFER OVERLEAF.**
- A disability parking permit will incur a fee and be issued for a period of up to five years.
- This application is to be completed by an authorised representative of an eligible organisation.
- Sole traders or individuals providing services for people with disabilities that include transportation services do not qualify for a DPP. They can only be issued to an organisation.
- Please REFER OVERLEAF for how to submit this application and fee.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR A DISABILITY PARKING PERMIT

- A person must meet one of the criteria below:
- They are legally blind.
- They have a mobility impairment which requires the use of a mobility aid or device (a wheelchair, motorised mobility device, walking frame, crutches or walking stick).
- They have a medical condition or impairment which severely restricts their speed of movement or results in difficulty walking short distances without stopping due to pain, extreme fatigue or imbalance.
- They have a significant cognitive, behavioural or neurological impairment which results in them being unable to mobilise safely without the continuous support of another person.

POWER OF REGISTRAR OF MOTOR VEHICLES TO REQUIRE EVIDENCE

- Please be aware that the Registrar of Motor Vehicles can require organisations to provide any supporting evidence or information as part of their application to confirm their eligibility for a DPP.

HOW TO SUBMIT THIS APPLICATION

- In person: Take the completed form to a Service SA Centre.
- By post: Mail the completed form with the correct fee (cheque or money order only) to: Service SA, GPO Box 1533, Adelaide SA 5000.
- The required fee must be submitted with the application.
