

Frequently Asked Questions

Is Property Location Browser free to use?

PLB is a free map-based web site. Information can be found for Properties, Survey Marks, Geographic Names and Land Administration Boundaries.

How can I search for a property?

Click on the 'Quick Search' option or 'Find' button and enter the property details. You can also zoom over the state map to the area of interest.

How can I see the street numbers?

Click on the 'Layers' Button and turn on the 'Street Number' option.

How can I find the area of my property?

PLB provides an option to calculate the approximate area of an allotment. However, the map projection is not suitable to determine an accurate area.

Measurements for calculating the accurate area of allotments are generally provided on Survey Plans and Certificate of Titles, which are available through the www.sailis.sa.gov.au website.

How can I find the measurements of my property?

PLB provides an option to calculate an approximate measurement. However, the map projection is not suitable to determine an accurate measurement.

Measurements for property boundaries are provided on Survey Plans and Certificate of Titles, which are available through the www.sailis.sa.gov.au website.

The Land Services Group encourages clients to engage the services of a Licensed Surveyor to determine the location of property boundaries.

How current is parcel information?

New divisions of land are usually added to the PLB within a month following deposit of the plan. Data updates to the PLB occur each night. House numbers and Street names are allocated by relevant councils and may not initially be associated with recent divisions of land.

Why does my boundary not align with the digital image?

The land boundaries shown are a graphical representation only with varying spatial accuracy. Displacement (visually) between boundaries and the digital image will occur, particularly in the rural areas.
